Strategic Plan Information

Attached to the newsletter email will be the first goal of the strategic plan in more detail. As you will see from this our big focus this year is around reading and strengthening ākonga (teacher and student) capability in this across the school. While the base of our programme is around instructional, structured literacy there are many facets to an effective literacy programme which are called the "Six Pillars of Reading" and have the following components:

Oral Language, Phonological Awareness, Phonics, Vocabulary, Reading Fluency, Comprehension

Update on Mānuka Refurb and Refit

This is at the surveying stage with our project managers. From here it will go to the Ministry of Education who will be asked for the extra funding needed to complete this project. At this point in time we have no reason to believe it will not be started later this year, however, it is dependent on what the MOE comes back with.

Education Review Office (ERO)

At the end of 2023 we started our cycle with our ERO partner who will be working alongside our kura for the next three years. The model of how ERO works has changed markedly and, instead of being in a school for a week and writing a report based on what they see and learn within a week, they have a new methodology. We are in the very early stages of the review where we are working through the compliance information they have requested. We look forward to continuing this work and taking on board any feedback and feed forward we receive.

This Week's Focus


Aroha




