As many of you will already know Julie McDonald has reigned her permanent classroom teaching position and she finishes with us at the end of Term 3 this year.

Julie has been with us since the start of 2020 and has made a wonderful contribution to our kura in her time here and has taught many of your children.

She has been a our Positive Behaviour for Learning Lead Coach, completed restorative practice training and has been part of implementing our whānau house programme and this year working with our leaders. Last year she took up the role of Jump Jam coach and in her first season her team won which enabled them to go to Nationals. Julie has been instrumental in sourcing and preparing the information for our REACH assemblies. In 2022 she co-wrote and was technical support for our production. Julie has been an active member of our PTA for many years and I know that the PTA have valued that parent/teacher connection that she brought.

Alongside this Julie has completed many professional development opportunities. For example she has completed one and a half years in Te Reo Māori language acquisition which required three hours a week in her own time and 6 full days in her holidays or weekends. 
